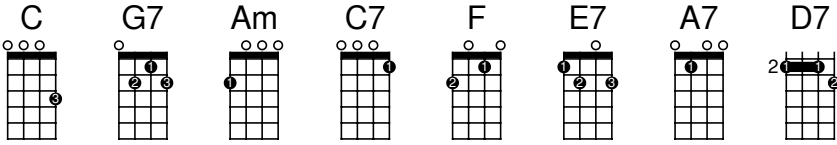


I'm so Lonesome I could Cry
